SUMMER TERM 2024

Welcome back to a new and exciting term. We hope you all had a wonderful spring break and look forward to a happy and eventful summer term.

Our Topics

Our learning in nursery for the first half term will be based around the themes of *People Who Help Us* and *Traditional Tales*. We are going to investigate the roles of different people in our community and find out how they help others. We invite any nursery family members in to talk about their job role, or, to send in photographs. Please see Dojo for more information. To help embed our learning, we will enjoy a trip to Tiny Town Adventures where the children will be able to express themselves and develop their understanding of the world through collaborative role play. Later this half term, we will practise being fabulous storytellers and will create story maps to help us retell tales such as 'The Gingerbread Man' and 'Jack and the Beanstalk'.

Our final half term will follow the themes of *Changing and Growing* and *Getting Ready for School*. We will learn about the lifecycle of a butterfly and will work together to look after our very own class caterpillars! We will plant flowers and buds to help transform our nursery garden for summer and will learn what we must do to help our flowers grow. We will also think about how we have grown since starting nursery and will celebrate the amazing and very grown-up things we can do now!

We look forward to inviting you in to our nursery on many occasions over the final few months together. We have some exciting plans for our Father's Day celebrations in June, will enjoy our very own Sports Day next half term and will invite all families to an end of year family picnic in our nursery garden. In the week after half term, we will be asking parents and carers to join us in the nursery garden, where we will be planting up our flower bed. We will ask you to kindly bring in a bedding plant to plant with your child.

Alongside our topics, we will continue to develop important speaking and listening skills and learn to recognise, segment and blend sounds in words. We will practise writing our names and holding our pencils using the correct grip, ready for starting school in September.
